## PURCHASES BY OTHER

### LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, SCHOOL DISTRICTS, AND NON PROFIT AGENCIES

As per the New York State General Municipal Law, all political subdivisions of New York State are allowed to make purchases through the resulting contract(s). As per Rockland County Procurement Policy, Non Profit Agencies approved to participate in New York State's Contract Extension Program are authorized to make purchases through the resulting contract(s).

1. The County of Rockland shall make all contract award information available to other political subdivisions and non profit agencies through our website: [www.rcpurchasing.com](http://www.rcpurchasing.com)
2. Any other political subdivision or Rockland County non profit agency will issue purchase orders directly to vendors within the specified contract period referencing the County's contract and shall be liable for any payments due on such purchase orders; and shall accept sole responsibility for any payment due.
3. All purchases shall be subject to audit and inspection by the other political subdivisions and Rockland County non profit agencies for which the purchase was made.
4. No officer, board or agency of a county, town, village, or school district shall make any purchase through the County when bids have been received for such purchase by such officer, board or agency, unless such purchase may be made upon the same terms, conditions and specifications at a lower price through the County.
5. All Bidders shall be on notice that as a condition of the award of a County contract, the successful bidder shall accept the award of a similar contract with any other political subdivision in New York State and Rockland County non profit agencies authorized to use New York State's contracts, if called upon to do so. A listing of approved Rockland County non profit agencies is available on the Purchasing Division's website at [www.rcpurchasing.com](http://www.rcpurchasing.com). The County, however, will not be responsible for any debts incurred by the participants pursuant to this or any other agreement.
6. Necessary deviations from the County's specifications in the award of a participant contract, whether such deviations relate to quantities, or delivery points shall be resolved between the successful bidder and the other political subdivisions and Rockland County non profit agencies.

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## SPECIFICATIONS

### 1. SCOPE

**1.1** To provide hazardous environment clothing, to the Rockland County Fire and Emergency Services team. This document specifies the design and materials used to manufacture Innotex Series 6000 coats and pants to be worn during firefighting as covered by NFPA 1971. The protection offered should cover the upper section of the body. Garment sizing shall be done in accordance with NFPA 1500 and available for male and female firefighters. Generalized sizing such as small, medium, large, etc... shall be considered unacceptable.

### 2. SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

**2.1** The design, materials, workmanship, construction, and performance shall meet or exceed all National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) requirements as specified in NFPA 1971. The manufacturer shall supply the Certificates of Compliance from Underwriters Laboratories showing compliance to the standard. Detailed requirements related to NFPA certifications for each article of protective gear are detailed on the specifications pages along with warranty requirements detailed in Section 4.

**2.2** Respondents must be authorized dealers of fire protective equipment and provide documentation and certification of products bid in accordance with NFPA 1971 standards. Generalized sizing such as small, medium, large, etc... shall be considered unacceptable. ***NO EXCEPTIONS SHALL BE ALLOWED***

**2.3** The County reserves the right to have a demonstration of alternate products bid along with members of the Rockland County Fire and Emergency Services team to determine if product can be deemed approved equal.

**2.4** Vendor shall provide a list of five references nearest to The County of Rockland providing the type of hazardous environment clothing specified in the bid package.

**2.5** Affirmative Action Plan, affidavits, and required forms must be completely filled out, notarized, signed, and returned with bid or bid will be rejected as non-responsive.

**2.6** Manufacturer's names, model or stock numbers and product code are to be entered in the brand name column on the proposal pages and extended price must be written in appropriate price columns. Do not put total price in unit price column. Unit price is to be multiplied by number of items specified on proposal pages and entered in extended price column.

**2.7** The successful vendor shall make available to the County of Rockland the services of a trained technician to take individual measurements of the fire and emergency services team for final fitting of hazardous environment clothing. These services shall be required on as an as needed basis at various locations within the County to be determined by the County of Rockland. No Travel Charges will be authorized, and any adjustments needed based on measurements will be as the sole cost to the vendor.

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### **3. APPROVED EQUALS**

**3.1** If the bidder is bidding approved equal, they shall provide references showing locations the County of Rockland can visit of the exact make and model intended to be supplied. If bidding an alternate or approved equal, two copies of brochures, specifications, and any other pertinent information shall be sent with bid.

**3.2** In the event an alternate is bid; the County of Rockland reserves the right to request a demonstration of the specific model bid. Failure to furnish the demonstration may render the bid for that item, non-responsive.

**3.3** All specifications contained herein are considered minimum requirements for the manufacture and delivery of Firefighter's Hazardous Environment Clothing. The terms "minimum" and "maximum" shall define the respective constraints that apply to the overall design, dimensions or quality level established by the Rockland County Fire and Emergency Services, hereafter called purchaser. The term or equal shall define the degree of determined quality level and shall be the sole responsibility of the purchaser to judge whether the proposed equal submitted by the bidder meets the minimum established quality level. Where brand names are referenced, it shall be understood by the bidder that the specified brand and part number are open market commodities and, thus, must be furnished as specified herein. Where none of the aforementioned terms are referenced herein, the purchaser has established that no exceptions are permitted by the bidder.

**3.4** When bidding an alternate, bidder shall list all specifications on specification sheet next to product denoting differences from product bid to those specified.

### **4. WARRANTY**

**4.1** Warranty to the original purchaser of the firefighter helmet and non-electronic components are to be free of defects in materials and workmanship under normal use and service for a period of six (6) months from the date of manufacture. All warranties shall comply with the NFPA 1971 Standard for Fire Fighters Protective Clothing, 2018 revised edition.

### **5. EMERGENCY PURCHASES**

**5.1** The County of Rockland reserves the right to purchase from other sources, those items which are required on an emergency basis and cannot be completed immediately from stock by the vendor. The County of Rockland may authorize the contractor to expedite delivery of critical hazardous environment gear (FOB destination Prepaid and Add) through air freight, UPS, or other, on an exception basis. The County will bear the cost of shipping.

### **6. OPTIONS TO EXTEND**

**6.1** The County of Rockland and vendor, upon mutual agreement, shall extend the period of this agreement up to one (1) additional year after the initial award.

### **7. AWARD**

**7.1** This bid will be awarded to the lowest responsive and responsible vendor in accordance with the Rockland County Procurement Policy. The County reserves the right to award on a line by line basis to lowest responsible bidder. The County reserves the right to take bids separately if the Director of Purchasing approves a finding that the supply or service available under the contract will not meet a nonrecurring special need of the County of Rockland.
