LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, SCHOOL DISTRICTS, AND NON PROFIT AGENCIES

As per the New York State General Municipal Law, all political subdivisions of New York State are allowed to make purchases through the resulting contract(s). As per Rockland County Procurement Policy, Non Profit Agencies approved to participate in New York State's Contract Extension Program are authorized to make purchases through the resulting contract(s).

1. The County of Rockland shall make all contract award information available to other political subdivisions and non profit agencies through our website: **www.rcpurchasing.com**
2. Any other political subdivision or Rockland County non profit agency will issue purchase orders directly to vendors within the specified contract period referencing the County's contract and shall be liable for any payments due on such purchase orders; and shall accept sole responsibility for any payment due.
3. All purchases shall be subject to audit and inspection by the other political subdivisions and Rockland County non profit agencies for which the purchase was made.
4. No officer, board or agency of a county, town, village, or school district shall make any purchase through the County when bids have been received for such purchase by such officer, board or agency, unless such purchase may be made upon the same terms, conditions and specifications at a lower price through the County.
5. All Bidders shall be on notice that as a condition of the award of a County contract, the successful bidder shall accept the award of a similar contract with any other political subdivision in New York State and Rockland County non profit agencies authorized to use New York State's contracts, if called upon to do so. A listing of approved Rockland County non profit agencies is available on the Purchasing Division's website at www.rcpurchasing.com. The County, however, will not be responsible for any debts incurred by the participants pursuant to this or any other agreement.
6. Necessary deviations from the County's specifications in the award of a participant contract, whether such deviations relate to quantities, or delivery points shall be resolved between the successful bidder and the other political subdivisions and Rockland County non profit agencies.

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SPECIFICATIONS

1. SCOPE

1.1 The County of Rockland is seeking to award a contract, for the purchase of E-One Grinder Pumps and Parts, from an authorized dealer, on an as needed basis. Material must be new and unused. Brand name or approved equal. No refurbished units will be accepted.

2. PRICING

- 2.1. Pricing submitted for items to include FOB Destination, Orangeburg, NY 10962.
- 2.2. Rockland County Sewer District to provide all labor, rigging and plumbing.

3. BRAND NAME

- 3.1. The use of a brand name or approved equal is for the purpose of describing a standard of quality, performance, and characteristics desired and is not intended to limit or restrict competition.

4. EQUIPMENT

- 4.1. The following equipment is required:
 - 4.1.1. E-ONE Grinder Pump Model D200A01A01AA Core with a free ND0036G01 conversion kit, Service code 1262 conversion Kit.
 - 4.1.2. E-ONE Pump Control Board Furnish and Deliver Part Number 9543
 - 4.1.3. E-ONE Pump Control Board Furnish and Deliver Part Number 1103
- 4.2. The Rockland County Sewer District # 1 does not have written documentation nor photos on the existing equipment.

5. CONTRACT PRICE ADJUSTMENTS

- 5.1. The County recognizes this product or service has a price component that may have a commodity with changing costs. The Contractor/Supplier may request a Price Adjustment no more frequently than once during a 12 month period.
- 5.2. A Price Adjustment request must be made in writing and include the reason for the request, documentation supporting the request (i.e., commodity increases), the current pricing, and the requested revised pricing.
- 5.3. The County will review the Price Adjustment request. If the Price Adjustment is deemed reasonable the Price Adjustment request will be accepted by written acknowledgement. If the request is not

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accepted the County may entirely reject the request or may counter with revised pricing. In either case the County will provide a written explanation in support of the decision.

- 5.4. The Director of Purchasing may use available indexes (e.g., CPI or PPI) to determine if the requested Price Adjustment is reasonable. Typically, a Price Adjustment that exceeds 5% will not be approved unless very unusual and significant changes have occurred in the industry.
- 5.5. In the event industry costs decline, the County shall have the right to receive, from the Contractor, a reasonable reduction in prices/pricing that reflect such cost changes in the industry. The County will make a written request to the Contractor for a Price Adjustment in writing with supporting documentation

6. **AWARD**

- 6.1. Bid will be awarded to the lowest responsive responsible bidder whose proposal and proposed grinder pumps and parts meet the stated requirements.
