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“New Requirement” Public Work Contractor and Subcontractor Registry

Starting December 30, 2024, all contractors and subcontractors submitting bids or performing construction work on public work projects or private projects covered by [Article 8 of the Labor Law](#) are required to register with the New York State Department of Labor (NYSDOL) under [Labor Law Section 220-i](#).

The law defines a “contractor” as any entity entering into a contract to perform construction, demolition, reconstruction, excavation, rehabilitation, repair, installation, renovation, alteration, or custom fabrication. The law defines “subcontractor” as any entity subcontracting with a contractor to perform construction, demolition, reconstruction, excavation, rehabilitation, repair, installation, renovation, alteration, or custom fabrication, which is subject to Article 8 of the Labor Law. Contractors are responsible for verifying that any subcontractors they work with are registered.

Contractors need to register before submitting any new bids or commencing new work on a covered project on or after December 30, 2024. Subcontractors need to register before commencing new work on a covered project on or after December 30, 2024. NYSDOL encourages all contractors and subcontractors to register as soon as possible to obtain a Certificate of Registration to avoid negatively impacting a bidding period or project schedule.

The Bureau of Public Work & Prevailing Wage Enforcement at the New York State Department of Labor is responsible for enforcing prevailing wage laws in New York State.

The Bureau of Public Work & Prevailing Wage Enforcement publishes the annual prevailing wage schedule every year on July 1. Electronic Certified Payroll Submissions in 2025

There is a new subsection 220-j in Article 8, which will require the Department of Labor to develop a publicly accessible online database of electronic certified payroll records, which will be available no later than **December 31, 2025**.

All submissions of certified payroll records will be collected electronically through this forthcoming database, starting when the system is completed in 2025.

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**PURCHASES BY UNITED STATES AGENCIES, OTHER STATES AND POLITICAL
SUBDIVISIONS THEREIN, LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, SCHOOL DISTRICTS,
AND NON-PROFIT AGENCIES**

As per the New York State General Municipal Law, § 103(3) all political subdivisions of New York State are allowed to make purchases through the resulting contract(s). As per Rockland County Procurement Policy § 140-13, the United States of America or any agency thereof, any state, or any other political subdivision or district therein and certain Non-Profit Agencies approved to participate in New York State's Contract Extension Program are authorized to make purchases through the resulting contract(s).

1. The County of Rockland shall make all contract award information available to other political subdivisions and non-profit agencies through the **Empire Procure Connect Marketplace**.
2. Any other political subdivision or Rockland County non-profit agency will issue purchase orders directly to vendors within the specified contract period referencing the County's contract and shall be liable for any payments due on such purchase orders; and shall accept sole responsibility for any payment due.
3. All purchases shall be subject to audit and inspection by the other political subdivisions and Rockland County non-profit agencies for which the purchase was made.
4. No officer, board or agency of a county, town, village, or school district shall make any purchase through the County when bids have been received for such purchase by such officer, board or agency, unless such purchase may be made upon the same terms, conditions and specifications at a lower price through the County.
5. All Bidders shall be on notice that as a condition of the award of a County contract, the successful bidder shall accept the award of a similar contract with any other political subdivision in New York State and Rockland County non-profit agencies authorized to use New York State's contracts, if called upon to do so. A listing of approved Rockland County non-profit agencies is available on the Purchasing Division's website at www.rcpurchasing.com. The County, however, will not be responsible for any debts incurred by the participants pursuant to this or any other agreement.
6. Necessary deviations from the County's specifications in the award of a participant contract, whether such deviations relate to quantities, or delivery points shall be resolved between the successful bidder and the other political subdivisions and Rockland County non-profit agencies.

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SPECIFICATIONS

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1. SCOPE OF WORK

- 1.1. The County of Rockland is seeking a contractor to furnish all labor, equipment, materials and supervision required to perform all operations necessary in connection with marking out and striping of parking lots and interior approach roads at various County of Rockland Facilities.

2. JOB DESCRIPTION

- 2.1. Under this work, the Contractor shall furnish all necessary supervision, labor, equipment and materials to lay out and mark-out where the new painting/stripping shall be applied.
- 2.2. Under this work, the Contractor shall furnish and apply reflectorized pavement marking paint at the locations marked out and in accordance with the patterns indicated on the plans or as directed by the Engineer, and in accordance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) and these specifications.
- 2.3. Two types of reflectorized paint applications will be required first, general line striping of parking stalls (both handicap and regular) that will only require the application of approved pavement marking paint **without** the application of glass beads and second, line striping of crosswalks, stop bars and letters with the application of glass beads.

3. GENERAL

- 3.1. All pavement markings and patterns shall be placed as shown in the contract documents and in accordance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, (MUTCD).
- 3.2. Before any pavement marking work is begun a schedule of operations shall be submitted to and approved by an Engineer of The County of Rockland.
- 3.3. When pavement markings are applied under traffic, the Contractor shall provide all the necessary flags, signs, cones, shadow vehicles, flashing arrow boards, etc. to maintain and protect traffic, to protect the work operation, and to protect the painted pavement markings until thoroughly dry and serviceable. No additional payment will be made for these items.
- 3.4. The application of pavement markings shall be done in the general direction of traffic. Striping against the direction of normal flow of traffic shall not be allowed.
- 3.5. The Contractor shall be responsible for cleaning the pavement, to the satisfaction of the Engineer, of dust, dirt, and other foreign material, which may be detrimental to the adhesion of the paint film.
- 3.6. When necessary, the Contractor shall establish marking line points at 30 feet intervals throughout the length of the pavement or as directed by the Engineer. The Contractor shall be responsible for removing, to the satisfaction of the Engineer, all tracking marks, spilled paint, and paint applied in unauthorized areas at no additional cost to the County.

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- 3.7. For newly paved parking lot, County will provide control points or latest aerial photos of the previous striping to assist the Contractor layout. Revised striping plan will be provided to the Contractor by the County if required. The Contractor shall be responsible for layout the newly paved parking lots using those control points/aerial photos/revised striping plan provided by the County prior to the striping of the parking lots. There will be no cost adjustment by the County for the Contractor to perform the layout of the newly paved parking lots. The cost of the layout is to be included in the appropriate unit price for the striping.
- 3.8. Parking lots Striping may require work after normal working hours or Saturdays due to the availability of parking lots during the normal working hours, Monday through Friday 8am – 5pm. There will be no cost adjustment by the County for the Contractor to perform the striping of the parking lots after normal working hours or Saturdays.

4. MATERIALS

- 4.1. All Reflectorized pavement marking paints shall be selected from the New York State Department of Transportation's Approved List of White and Yellow Reflectorized Pavement Marking Paints.
- 4.2. Project acceptance will be based on the appearance of an approved brand name on the container label.
- 4.3. All paints shall conform to Federal, State, and local air pollution regulations, including those for the control (emission) of volatile organic compounds (VOC) as established by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, and the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.
- 4.4. Reflective glass beads shall conform to §727-05 Glass Beads for Reflectorized Pavement Marking Paints.
- 4.5. Details for obtaining Approved List status are available from the NYSDOT Materials Bureau.

5. APPLICATION OF PAVEMENT MARKINGS

- 5.1. At the time of paint application, the pavement surface and ambient temperature shall not be less than 50°F, the relative humidity shall not exceed 85%, and the pavement surface shall be dry.
- 5.2. Traffic paint shall not be applied during periods of rain or if rain is imminent. Waterborne traffic paint shall not be applied if rain is expected within 4 hours after application.
- 5.3. Paint shall be applied in strict accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations for use. In no case shall the paint be heated above 150°F. The painted pavement markings shall be uniformly applied to the pavement surface at the minimum specified wet film thickness. Immediately following paint application, reflective glass beads shall be uniformly applied to the wet paint film at the rate of 6 lb./gal. of paint.
- 5.4. The applied pavement markings shall have clean-cut edges and true and smooth alignment. On pavements where traffic is to be maintained and the final marking pattern is known, traffic paint shall be applied before the end of the work shift. If the Contractor is unable to apply final pavement markings and traffic is to be maintained, then removable pavement markings offset from the final pavement markings shall be installed in accordance with Section 619 Work Zone Traffic Control at no additional cost to the County.

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6. METHOD OF MEASUREMENT

- 6.1. Pavement striping will be measured in feet along the centerline of the pavement stripe and shall be based on a 4 inches wide stripe. Measurement for striping with a plan width greater or less than the basic 4 inches as shown in the contract documents or as directed by the Engineer, will be made by the following method:

Plan Width of Striping (inches) x Feet*4 inches*

- 6.2. No payment will be made for the number of feet of gaps in between the dashed lines.
- 6.3. Words, numbers and symbols will be measured on a per each basis based on the size of the symbol, number or word being installed. The following schedule will be utilized:

6.3.1. Symbols are to be paid as follows:

- 6.3.1.1. Left Arrow, Right arrow, Straight Arrow, Handicap Parking Symbol:
 Full Size, 3/4 Size, 1/2 Size

6.3.1.1.1. Full size Left, Right or Straight Arrow	= 540 lf of equivalent 4-inch line
6.3.1.1.2. 3/4 size Left, Right or Straight Arrow	= 405 lf of equivalent 4-inch line
6.3.1.1.3. 1/2 size Left, Right or Straight Arrow	= 270 lf of equivalent 4-inch line
6.3.1.1.4. Full, 3/4 and 1/2 size Handicap	= 20 lf of equivalent 4-inch line

6.3.2. Words:

- 6.3.2.1. Stop, Only, School, Yield: Full Size, 3/4 Size, 1/2 Size

Plan Width of Striping (inches) x Feet x Correction factor*4 inches*

- 6.3.2.2. With this word set no deduction will be made for spacing therefore it will be calculated as the plan width being that shown on the drawing (Sheet 8 of 9) as the height of word in inches multiplied by the length shown in feet then divided by 4 inches. Should a 3/4 or 1/2 size word in this group be required then the calculation shown above will be multiplied by a correction factor of .75 for 3/4 size words and .5 for 1/2 size words.

- 6.3.2.2.1. Example: A 3/4 size "School" word would be calculated as follows:

Word height = 8'-4" = 100 inches

Length = 9'-8" = 9.67 feet

(100") * 9.67 feet = 241.75 feet * .75 (correction factor) = 181.3 feet 4 inches

- 6.3.2.3. The following words (phrases) will be measured as equivalent feet of 4-inch line striping:

6.3.2.3.1. 36 Inch - Do Not Enter, No Parking, Fire Zone = 60 lf of equivalent 4-inch line

6.3.2.3.2. 24 Inch - Do Not Enter, No Parking, Fire Zone = 40 lf of equivalent 4-inch line

6.3.2.3.3. 18 Inch - Do Not Enter, No Parking, Fire Zone = 30 lf of equivalent 4-inch line

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6.3.2.3.4. 12 Inch - Do Not Enter, No Parking, Fire Zone = 20 lf of equivalent 4-inch line

6.3.2.3.4.1. Example: Painting 24 inch "No Parking" would measure for payment to be 40 lf each time "No Parking" was painted.

6.3.3. Numbers & Letters:

6.3.3.1. Standard 10" numbers and letters for parking space identification shall be billed per each.

7. BASIS OF PAYMENT

7.1. The accepted quantities of pavement markings will be paid for at the contract unit price bid. This unit price bid shall include as a minimum the cost of furnishing all labor, materials, and equipment to satisfactorily complete the work, including the parking lots layout or work after normal working hours or Saturdays. The cost for maintaining and protecting traffic during the painting operations shall also be included in the price bid. The application of Short-Term Pavement Markings, necessitated by the Contractor's failure to apply the required Reflectorized Pavement Marking Paints, shall be at no additional cost to the County.

8. LABOR

8.1. This contract is subject to **New York State Labor Law 220, Article 8 Prevailing wages**. The Contractor shall submit with, each invoice, certified payrolls for all labor. Submission of Certified Payroll with invoice is a condition of payment.

9. EXPERIENCE

9.1. Contractor shall submit with their bid a list of three jobs similar in size and scope to the work specified that they have completed within the last year. Bidder shall include a contact name and telephone number for these references.

10. CONTRACT PRICE ADJUSTMENTS UPON RENEWAL

10.1. The bid rates shall remain firm through the first contract period with no adjustments allowed. If the County exercises any of the option years of the award, Contractors may submit a request for adjustment on the yearly anniversary date of the contract. Any request for price adjustment(s) shall be submitted thirty (30) days in advance in writing to the Director of Purchasing. Any, and all, price adjustments will be limited to the percentage increase in the CPI or PPI Index, no more than 5%, for the preceding 12 months. The County reserves the right to reject any request for price increase deemed excessive.

10.2. CPI-Index - Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers as published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor or a successor or substitute index, appropriately adjusted.

10.3. PPI-Index – Producer Price Index, as published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor, or any successor or substitute index, appropriately adjusted.

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11. **GUARANTEE**

11.1. All labor and material shall be guaranteed to perform as specified for a period of one year. Any evidence of paint peeling, alligating, abnormal fade and wear or similar defects shall be corrected by the contractor at no charge within 30 calendar days after notification by the Owner.

12. **BASIS OF AWARD**

- 12.1. Award shall be made to the lowest total responsible bidder based on the unit price bid multiplied by the estimated quantity indicated. All quantities shown are estimated. The estimates are for evaluation purposes only. The successful bidder shall be required to furnish quantities that may be more or less than the listed estimated quantities.
- 12.2. All items as listed on the proposal shall be, completely, filled out or bid will be rejected. All items indicated on the proposal pages shall include all labor, materials, equipment, and supervision to properly perform the tasks indicated.
