LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, SCHOOL DISTRICTS, AND NON PROFIT AGENCIES

As per the New York State General Municipal Law, all political subdivisions of New York State are allowed to make purchases through the resulting contract(s). As per Rockland County Procurement Policy, Non Profit Agencies approved to participate in New York State's Contract Extension Program are authorized to make purchases through the resulting contract(s).

1. The County of Rockland shall make all contract award information available to other political subdivisions and non profit agencies through our website: www.rcpurchasing.com
2. Any other political subdivision or Rockland County non profit agency will issue purchase orders directly to vendors within the specified contract period referencing the County's contract and shall be liable for any payments due on such purchase orders; and shall accept sole responsibility for any payment due.
3. All purchases shall be subject to audit and inspection by the other political subdivisions and Rockland County non profit agencies for which the purchase was made.
4. No officer, board or agency of a county, town, village, or school district shall make any purchase through the County when bids have been received for such purchase by such officer, board or agency, unless such purchase may be made upon the same terms, conditions and specifications at a lower price through the County.
5. All Bidders shall be on notice that as a condition of the award of a County contract, the successful bidder shall accept the award of a similar contract with any other political subdivision in New York State and Rockland County non profit agencies authorized to use New York State's contracts, if called upon to do so. A listing of approved Rockland County non profit agencies is available on the Purchasing Division's website at www.rcpurchasing.com. The County, however, will not be responsible for any debts incurred by the participants pursuant to this or any other agreement.
6. Necessary deviations from the County's specifications in the award of a participant contract, whether such deviations relate to quantities, or delivery points shall be resolved between the successful bidder and the other political subdivisions and Rockland County non profit agencies.

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SPECIFICATIONS

1. SCOPE

- 1.1. Provide chemicals and supplies as specified for the County of Rockland. Chemicals and Supplies shall be the brands specified or an approved equal. These chemicals shall be used for the control and eradication of mosquitos. The mosquitos targeted shall be, but not limited to, the culex pipen mosquitos.

2. REQUIREMENTS

- 2.1. All items must be as specified or approved equal or equivalent. Bidders must submit applicable SDS sheets and specifications with their bid.
- 2.2. All products shipped shall meet all Federal, State and Local Regulations.
 - 2.2.1. Bidder must submit any permits issued by Federal, State and/or Local allowing the sale of these products.
- 2.3. Bidder must submit the exact description of the packaging of all items being bid.
- 2.4. Bids containing restrictions will not be acceptable unless the Rockland County Purchasing Department deems the restrictions conform to the County of Rockland requirements.
- 2.5. Drums and/or cylinders to remain vendor's property and shall be furnished at no charge on an even exchange basis. No deposit or demurrage. The County of Rockland will be responsible for drums while in use on County property.
- 2.6. All quantities shown are estimates. The successful bidder will be required to furnish quantities if different than those used whether it is more or less during the term of the contract.

3. APPROVED EQUAL OR EQUIVALENT ITEMS

- 3.1. Bidder must submit Product Labels, specifications, cut sheets, and brochure data with his bid.
- 3.2. Bidders must also include name, address, contact and contact telephone number for three locations where product is being utilized.
- 3.3. Rockland County's determination on whether a product is an approved equal or equivalent is final.
- 3.4. Samples – If required, Bidder shall submit samples to the Purchasing Department: 50 Sanatorium Road, Building A, 6th floor, Pomona, NY 10970, Attention: Michele Phillips, for evaluation within five business days of notification from the Rockland County Purchasing Department.
- 3.5. All sample materials must be clearly labeled with the following information:
 - 3.5.1. Bid Number
 - 3.5.2. Bid Item Number
 - 3.5.3. Bid Item Description
 - 3.5.4. Product Name
 - 3.5.5. Vendor Name
- 3.6. Samples will be used for evaluation purposes and will not be returned unless otherwise agreed upon prior to sample submission. The evaluation of these products will be made by the user department based on trials, product review or experience.
- 3.7. Line Item #12- It has been determined that BioQuip Mini CDC Trap with UV Model # 2848BQ is not an approved equal.

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4. MINIMUM SPECIFICATIONS

- 4.1. Bidder must complete the Minimum Specifications pages.
- 4.2. Incomplete information may result in Bidder being deemed non-responsive.

5. BRAND NAME

- 5.1. The use of a brand name is for the purpose of describing a standard of quality, performance, and characteristics desired and is not intended to limit or restrict competition.

6. AWARD

- 6.1. This bid will be awarded on a line-by-line basis to the lowest responsible Bidder who meets requirements. Listed quantities are estimates. Actual amounts ordered may be greater or less than the estimated amounts.
- 6.2. The County of Rockland reserves the right to make a no award by line item.

7. PRICE ADJUSTMENT

- 7.1. The County recognizes this product or service has a price component that may have a commodity with changing costs. The Contractor/Supplier may request a Price Adjustment no more frequently than once each quarter (3-month period).

A Price Adjustment request must be made in writing and include the reason for the request, documentation supporting the request (ie, commodity increases), the current pricing, and the requested revised pricing.

The County will review the Price Adjustment request. If the Price Adjustment is deemed reasonable the Price Adjustment request will be accepted by written acknowledgement. If the request is not accepted the County may entirely reject the request or may counter with revised pricing. In either case the County will provide a written explanation in support of the decision.

The Director of Purchasing may use available indexes (e.g. CPI or PPI) to determine if the requested Price Adjustment is reasonable. Typically, a Price Adjustment that exceeds 5% will not be approved unless very unusual and significant changes have occurred in the industry.

In the event industry costs decline, the County shall have the right to receive, from the Contractor, a reasonable reduction in prices/pricing that reflect such cost changes in the industry. The County will make a written request to the Contractor for a Price Adjustment in writing with supporting documentation.
